San Lucas Lutheran Church @ \$2,230 proclaiming good news in Eagle Pass, TX


Helping Hands @ \$1,423 helping our neighbors in crisis

- I used to give to the church whatever was left at the end of the month, but now it's the first thing I budget. Basically, I've decided it matters, so I've made it a priority in my giving and spending.
