Older Adult: Babies trying over and over to take their first step. Teenager: The turning of seasons. Adult: Christian community. Child: Books. Older Adult: Friendship with my adult children. Teenager: Advocates for justice.

Adult: Hearing children in the pews sing the hymns.


Child: The sunrise every single morning.

We who feel scattered are held together.


We who have lost our way are forgiven and found.

Give wisdom to congregational councils, call committees, and ministry leaders. Keep us alert to unexpected opportunities for mission. God, in your mercy,

hear our prayer.

God of promise, your goodness is everlasting. We give thanks for the lives of the faithful who now rest in you. We trust that you will bring us into the company of all the saints with rejoicing. God, in your mercy,
